A reading from the book of Acts

In the first book, Theophilus, I wrote about all that Jesus did and taught from the beginning until the day when he was taken up to heaven, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles whom he had chosen. After his suffering he presented himself alive to them by many convincing proofs, appearing to them during forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God. While staying with them, he ordered them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for the promise of the Father. "This," he said, "is what you have heard from me; for John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days from now."

So when they had come together, they asked him, "Lord, is this the time when you will restore the kingdom to Israel?" He replied, "It is not for you to know the times or periods that the Father has set by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." When he had said this, as they were watching, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. While he was going and they were gazing up toward heaven, suddenly two men in white robes stood by them. They said, "Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking up toward heaven? This Jesus, who has been taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven."





Nurse's Corner

Kay Lahdenpera, the Parish Nurse would like to share updates on two national health issues.

The CDC has developed a new tool to help communities decide what prevention steps need to be taken based on the latest information regarding COVID-19. Levels are categorized as low/medium/and high. Take precautions by knowing what your

current community level is. As of 5/23/22 Hillsborough and Pinellas counties level is high. The CDC recommends that masks be worn in public indoor spaces when the level is categorized as high.

Florida's first Monkeypox case was reported on 5/23/22 in Brevard County as a result of travel. Monkeypox cases *are rare* in the US, but it is important to know the symptoms (particularly if you have recently traveled and/or had contact with imported animals). Monkeypox symptoms include fever, headache, muscle aches, swollen lymph nodes, chills and fatigue. A rash occurs 1 to 3 days after onset. Symptoms are similar to, but milder than smallpox. The incubation period is 7-14 days.
